## **McAuley School Rules**

**BE RESPECTFUL - BE RESPONSIBLE - BE SAFE**

**FOCUS FOR THE FORTNIGHT: We are responsible and safe within our school environment.**

It is all of our responsibility to ensure we act responsibly in our school to ensure the safety of others. All members of our school community must keep their hands and feet to themselves and follow all school rules.

***Before & After School Care at McAuley:*** We have been given the clearance to begin OCSH at McAuley.

***Our start date is Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> July.*** It has taken a while to be granted the official approval but I am sure it will be worth it. **Applications for enrolment are available in the school front office and the school website when it is up and running again.** Centacare will run the McAuley OCSH. They are currently recruiting staff and the enrolments will go through them. Enrolments can be emailed to [mcauleyoshc@centacarebathurst.com.au](mailto:mcauleyoshc@centacarebathurst.com.au) or dropped into the school office.

***Parent Teacher Interviews:*** A big thank you to our teachers for all their efforts with reports and parent teacher interviews this week. They are very beneficial and great communication between home and school. Remember our teachers have had a full day teaching and then several hours in the afternoons talking to parents about the progress, achievements and areas to work on for their children. We thank our dedicated teachers for all their time and efforts reporting on the children in their class both written and verbally.

***Out of Bounds: No child is allowed to leave the school grounds without permission. No child is allowed to walk to the shops and then come back to school to catch a bus.*** Occasionally balls will be kicked or thrown over the fences surrounding the playground. Children are not permitted to leave the school grounds to get a ball. If a teacher has time they may be able to retrieve it otherwise parents can go and ask the neighbours if they can retrieve it after school. Often the neighbours will throw balls back over the fence or return them.

***Technology at School:*** A reminder that students are not to have mobile phones, ipods and other technology at school. If it is necessary that they bring such a device then it is to be given to the class teacher at the beginning of the day and collected at the conclusion of school. Important messages can be delivered via the school office.

***Southern Region Athletics Carnival:*** The Southern Region Athletics Carnival will be held on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> August in Blayney. **PLEASE NOTE THE CHANGE OF DATE AND VENUE.** *Notes have been sent home with the children who will represent Catherine McAuley at the carnival.*

### **From the Religious Education Coordinator**

**Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time:** This week's Gospel from Mark focuses on the healing power of our faith. It is a story of two people both in need of the power of God. Jairus, a highly regarded temple official, believes that Jesus has the power to save his very sick little girl. He begs Jesus to follow him to his house and the crowds to whom Jesus was preaching, follow to see if he will save the child. They press against him as he walks, making his journey difficult. In the crowd is a lowly respected woman who has been sick and haemorrhaging for many years. She is seen as diseased and unclean. But her faith is so strong, that she believes all she has to do is touch the hem of Jesus' cloak, and she will be cured of her illness. Pushing forward, she reaches out and touches his cloak. Immediately she feels her body being healed. Jesus is aware of the power leaving him and stops, questioning the apostles 'who has touched me?' With so many people crowding around him, the apostles are quite taken back by the question and impatient with Jesus. But he won't be moved until he knows. The woman gingerly comes forward and explains herself. While others look on her with disgust, Jesus praises her faith. He then goes on to bring life back into the Temple official's daughter who had by this time passed away. This Gospel is about the faith these people had, and how they were healed of their troubles through this faith. Our faith can heal us in so many ways, especially in the brokenness and unease within ourselves. He took away this woman's disease. He can take away our disease as well. Each time we come to ask for his healing and forgiveness, especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we are one with the woman and the child, receiving new life and hope for our future.

**"Assist – a – Student" Casual Clothes Day:** We will have a casual clothes day on our last day of the term, Friday, 6<sup>th</sup> July, to raise money to assist with the education of the children we are sponsoring in Fiji. All children are invited to wear casual clothes to school and bring a gold coin donation. We began to assist these families through this program four years ago, and now some of these children have gone on to University! This program, which runs in conjunction with St Vincent de Paul, helps cover the educational expenses of these children in Fiji, enabling them to complete their primary and secondary education. We all know the costs involved in our own children's education, and for most Fijian families, just finishing Primary School often proves too costly, both financially and in terms of the time the children spend away from helping the family. For a very small amount of approximately \$80.00 per year, we are able to provide all that is needed for these children to attend school and gain an education. The money raised will go directly to the families we are now sponsoring. We received lovely thank you letters from the students, along with updates on their educational progress and photos of them proudly wearing their school uniforms. Once again, could I please ask you to continue your support for this wonderful program by sending children to school dressed in casual clothes, and offering a gold coin donation.

**Confirmation:** Enrolments for Confirmation are now open but close at the end of next week and need to be completed online. Year 6 have now begun their preparation to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, which will be administered by Bishop Michael McKenna on the weekend of 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> August 2018. Bishop Michael will also be visiting the Year 6 students on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> August as part of their preparation. Please keep the Year 6 Confirmation candidates and their teachers in your prayers as they begin this journey towards full Initiation into the Catholic Church.

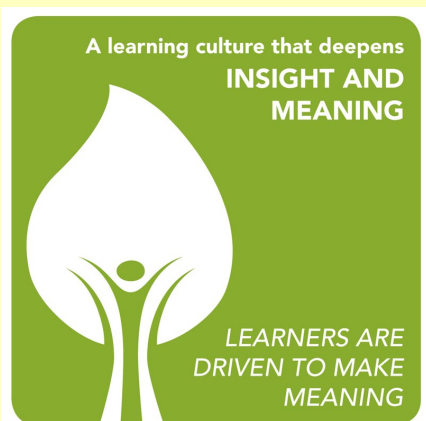

## Important information for Parents from the Office of the Children's Guardian

### People who work with my kids

Anyone who works face-to-face with your child must have a Working With Children Check clearance (or a completed application in progress), unless they qualify for an exemption. It does not matter whether they are paid, volunteering or self-employed.

This includes people that you may personally engage to work directly with your children, such as:

- au pairs and nannies (except privately arranged babysitting)
- tutors
- sporting coaches
- music teachers.

### Verify clearances online

If you directly engage a person in child-related work, you need to verify their Working With Children Check number online before they commence work.

### **The process to verify a person online is quick and simple:**

Visit <https://www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au> (Parents section)

#### Visit the **verification page for individuals**

- Enter your details in the form
- Enter in the workers family name, birth date, Working With Children Check number or Application number.
- Click the *Submit* button at the bottom-right of the page
- You will receive an email (or a letter if you do not provide an email address) with the status of that person's Working With Children Check (e.g. "Cleared", "Barred" or "Not found").

Visit the **Employer Verification** page to see what each possible status means.

**Please note** if a person is barred, interim barred or not found then you cannot engage them in child-related work.

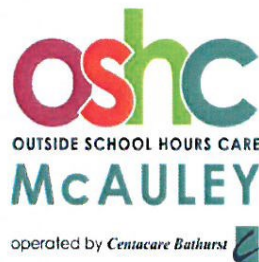
